Dear Operators:

As more of the population in Contra Costa County becomes fully vaccinated and we all still maintain social distancing and masking, there is a direct effect to the State metrics dictating county restrictions. While the State has moved Contra Costa County into the **Moderate/Orange Tier**, restrictions for indoor spas still remain the same and the following highlights the status of various types of operations:

- **OUTDOOR** pools/spas can be **OPEN**.
- **INDOOR** pools can be **OPEN**.
- **INDOOR** spas are still **CLOSED**.
  - ◊ *Therapy spas at licensed medical facilities used for therapeutic purposes continue to be exempted from the indoor spa closures.*

We are hopeful that an increase in vaccinations will continue the downward trend of transmission of COVID-19 allowing Contra Costa County to transition into the **Minimal/Yellow Tier** relatively soon. Indoor spas can open in the **Minimal/Yellow Tier**.

As a reminder, closed pools and spas must still be maintained to prevent safety hazards. It is important to maintain water chemistry to keep the water clear, make sure the pool/spa enclosure is in good repair, and ensure the pool/spa meets all current standards
