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The Contra Costa Environmental Health Division of the Contra Costa County Health Services Department, acting as the Local Enforcement Agency (LEA), is certified by the California Department of Resources, Recycling and Recovery (CalRecycle) to enforce state laws and regulations at solid waste sites within its jurisdiction. The Contra Costa Transfer & Recovery Station ("Facility") operates under Solid Waste Facility Permit No. 07-AA-0027, issued by the LEA on February 8, 2012. On May 12, 2017, the LEA received an application from the Facility operator for an amendment to the Report of Facility Information (RFI). The RFI, a document that describes the design and operation of a solid waste facility, is a required component of an application for a solid waste facility permit.

As required by Section 21660.1 of Title 27 of the California Code of Regulations, the LEA is distributing this notice for the purpose of noticing its approval of an amendment to the RFI for the Facility.

### **Description of Proposed Changes**

During the permit review for the facility it was determined that minor changes required amendment to the Facility's RFI. Most significant is the addition of three (3) additional transfer vehicle drivers from 13 to 16 to help facility comply with waste retention and disposal requirements. There is also an added statement that as needed additional staffing may be called in as needed to meet workloads. Other changes include correction of typographic errors, deletion of old historical text, and deletion of references to old sections of code that have been deleted and no longer exist.

### **LEA Determination**

The LEA has determined that the proposed changes are acceptable and consistent with the applicable State Minimum Standards, and do not conflict with the terms and conditions of the Solid Waste Facility Permit. The LEA has determined that the proposed changes are exempt from the requirements of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to Title 14, Chapter 3, Article 5, §§15060 and 15301. Pursuant to Section 21665(c) of Title 27 of the California Code of Regulations, the LEA approved the RFI amendments on July 10, 2017.
