## **Committee Chair Lambert** called the meeting to order at 4:06 p.m.

1.	Introduction of Members and Guests
2.	Approval of Minutes from December 14, 2022 meeting
	Member Vorhauer motioned to approve the minutes from December 14, 2022. The motion was seconded. Chair Lambert
	called for a roll call vote for approval of the motion. The roll call vote was done by EMCC Staff Support person Rachel Morris.
	Voting members Aguiar, Bowles, Drago, Fajardo, Goudarzi, Kestler, Lambert, Maples, McMurray, Santos, Vorhauer, and
	Wannamaker voted aye; no voting members opposed; voting members Blanco, Giusti, Gomez, King, Schlemmer, and Tobias
	were absent; motion passed. December 2022 minutes are approved.

4.	Chair's Report
	EMCC Chair Lambert reported that Kaiser Antioch and Kaiser Walnut Creek have seen average daily census starting to drop
	(from 250 to 207 at the end of February). Numbers are currently holding around 200. Conditions look to be improving.

6.	Fire Chiefs' Report – Chief Scott Wannamaker, Contra Costa County Fire Protection District (CCCFPD)

8.	Presentation: Tiered Response – Geoff Martin, Contra Costa County EMS Agency
	EMS Agency Staff member Geoff Martin gave a presentation on a proposed tiered response for the County to introduce BLS
	ambulances into the 911 plan. In 2022, the LEMSA began to pull data together to look at system response parameters. The
	purpose of the project was to take a data driven look at responses to find opportunities to introduce BLS ambulances into the

	system and to look at existing response parameters to see where adjustments could be made for patient and provider safety.
	Martin gave an overview of the project, project parameters, and project stats. With the proposed changes, the LEMSA hopes
	to free up about twenty (20) percent of ALS ambulances by sending BLS ambulances to qualifying calls. The data used in the
	presentation was focused on Contra Costa County Fire Protection District (CCCFPD)/Alliance data.
9.	EMCC Non-Officer Executive Committee Member Appointments – Rachel Morris, Contra Costa EMS Agency
	There are currently two vacancies on the EMCC Executive Committee for the two (2) non-officer positions. Per the Bylaws,
	"whenever a vacancy occurs on the Executive Committee, the EMCC shall elect an EMCC member to fill the vacant position to
	complete the remainder of the existing term." Chair Lambert asked if any members are interested in filling the vacant positions. Then Staff Morris offered background on the typical duties of the Executive Committee members. Morris added that
	the terms of the current Executive Committee members will terminate on November 30, 2023, and the Committee will need
	to conduct the nomination process for a new Executive Committee term this year. No members voiced interest in filling the
	current vacancies on the Executive Committee at the meeting.
10.	Quarterly Update on Alliance Ambulance Services – Chief Scott Wannamaker, Contra Costa County Fire Protection District
10.	(CCCFPD)
	Update on the Transfer of Care Policy. The Alliance leadership has been meeting with hospitals, mostly in east county. The
	meetings have been going well and expectations are equal on both sides. There are plans to continue meetings with hospitals
	in west county. Receiving good feedback from hospitals on efforts to help with ambulance stacking, watching multiple patients
	in hospital overload situations. The Alliance has also seen call volume seems to be trending down in the short term, similar to
	the comments in the Chair's Report. Member Bennett commented on the Transfer of Care policy, highlighting the focus on
	communication and cooperation between EMS field staff and hospital staff and commending the policy.
11.	EMS Medical Director's Report – Senai Kidane, MD, Contra Costa EMS Agency Medical Director
	The Public comment period is closed for suggestions for field treatment guideline revisions for 2024. LEMSA is currently in the
	development process for the few changes that have been proposed. Once development is completed, it will go back out for
	public comment again for feedback.
12.	EMS Director's Report – Marshall Bennett, Contra Costa EMS Agency Director
	- Anyone with questions on the proposed tiered response project is encouraged to reach out to the LEMSA as it is a large
	system change for all to work through. The project will be a pilot implementation focused in central county and will build out
	from there.
	- Update on the EMS System Evaluation that the LEMSA has commissioned to inform the next RFP. Background: within statute, there are provisions and authority given to counties through the LEMSA to define and award exclusive operating areas (EOAs)
	to providers. In Contra Costa County, there are five (5) emergency response areas and three (3) of them are in a single EOA
	and currently are awarded to Contra Costa Fire who subcontracts with AMR to provide emergency ambulance service. That
	contract is set to expire Dec 31, 2025, so a process is beginning to objectively evaluate the system. Bennett thanked those who
	have already participated in surveys, interviews, etc. with the FITCH consultant. A report is due in May to go to the Board of
	Supervisors. There may still be more in person visits. The LEMSA will inform of any future opportunities for meetings/public
	forums.
	-Currently a lot of EMS legislation in CA related to APOT, data transparency from LEMSAs to EMSA, EMDs and paramedics
	given authority to write 5150s. Interesting legislative season for anyone interested.
