QUALITY MATTERS!

Programs shall be clean, safe, sanitary, and in good repair at all times for the safety and well-being of clients, employees, and visitors. *Certifications Standards Section 20000 a 1 A B C D E; 2-7 Title 9 Article 4 Section 10581 (a) (1-3) (A-B) (4) (b-f) (1-3)*

When facilities are dirty or in disrepair, they can have a very negative impact on both safety standards and overall morale. The QI Team will be paying particular attention to the physical environment during the next round of site reviews. Some examples to keep in mind are: the quality of the carpeting and furniture and overall cleanliness including the restrooms, windows, and the front desk area. Are the resource materials neat and easily accessed? Are the group room and educational materials inviting and inspiring or is everything just laying around in disarray? Is the children's play area orderly? Are the toys clean and in good condition? Is the program van clean inside and out? Residential programs should be checking the quality of linens, towels, dishes, pots, pans, and utensils. When was the last time the pillows and mattress covers were replaced? Do the dresser drawers close properly? Are there enough hangers? Chipped, scratched dishes, ratty, stained towels and blankets, pots and pans that have been burned, dented, or stained should be replaced.

TEMPORARY TUBERCULOSIS (TB) WAIVER GRANTED BY HEALTH OFFICER FOR RESIDENTIAL FACILITIES

On January 4, our office issued an Up-to-the-minute which included information on Waiver for TB Testing for SUD Residential Facilities covering the period of 01/02/2023–05/01/2023 as authorized by our County Health Officer Dr. Ori Tzvieli. This Waiver has been developed to help slow the spread of the more contagious COVID variants/ flu and the need to decrease non-emergency visits to Health Care facilities. Please note that the Risk Assessment Questions located on the TB Waiver must still be asked and TB Testing will be required if any of the four questions have a Yes response. We would like to remind you that if COVID community infection rates are low, there is no need to rely on the waiver.
