## **REPORT:**

Contra Costa Health HazMat Response Team (HMRT) on scene approximately 14:30. HMRT requested by Walnut Creek Police Department (WCPD) to package up and dispose of drug materials.

HMRT upon arrival observed that several people (family/friends) of deceased were in the home and one of the responding police officers was still on site. None were observed to be showing signs/symptoms of opioid/fentanyl exposure. The Officer Brookshire was still on scene said he was there when the deceased was discovered and was part of the team that searched the house. He was interviewed by the HMRT and no signs/symptoms

- WCPD assumed fentanyl overdose as the deceased had Narcan nearby.
- This is not a criminal case.

Response Objectives:

- 1. Determine of powdered substance is an opioid (i.e., fentanyl or derivative) with use of Nark II test kit and MX908 (trace detection on nearby surfaces that could contaminated).
- 2. Decontaminate surfaces if substance is positive for opioid/fentanyl with Dahlgren solution to deactivate opioid.
- 3. If negative for opioid, WCPD requested that the substance and the plate on which the substance lies are triple-bagged and transferred to PD custody for further handling.

Response Timeline (to addition to the Telegram information):

- 1427 Arrived on scene HM1/3
- 1430 Made contact with Incident Commander, Ofc. Brookshire
- 1435 Team prepared to make entry
  - Atmospheric hazard monitoring QRae and PID
  - Identification tools Nark II test kit, MX908 (trace detection on contaminated surfaces)
  - PPE Level C with APR
  - Entry Team DL and JP; Back up XB
- Decon solution for surface contamination Dahlgren would not be prepared unless substance tested positive for opioid/fentanyl
- 1440 SD arrived on scene
- 1450 Pre-entry Safety Briefing
- 1452 Entry Team headed downrange into the home
- 1454 Entry Team in bedroom
- 1457 Entry Team took sample of substance for analysis by Nark II test; PID and CGI had normal readings
- 1457 Entry Team reported no color change to Nark II test NEGATIVE for opioid
  - Dahlgren not prepared
    - Proceeded to triple-bag plate and powered substance
- 1\$02 Entry Team out of the home; decon not necessary.
- \$03 Entry Team transferred bagged substance and plate to WCPD
  - Team departed scene
