BACKGROUND

CCHSHMP received a call from Naomi of the Contra Costa County Public Works Department (CCCPW) about the aftermath of a traffic collision at the listed incident location. A vehicle had release automotive fluid, e.g., engine oil, into a waterway. CCCPW requested that CCHSHMP help with clean-up. Asuncion spoke with Mike Giles, a CCCPW Field Operations Manager. He had confirmed the request for CCHSHMP to help with clean-up of residual oil in an active tributary that drains into the Delta. Additionally, he asked that CCHSHMP also pick up four (4) 5-gallon buckets initially reported as paint.

At 15:24, Springer arrived at the scene in his personally-owned vehicle. At 15:34, Asuncion and Umemoto arrived in HM3/6868 and Abramians, also in her personally-owned vehicle. The incident location was in front a gated entrance to a residence and a waterway that runs south of the entrance, from west to north-east. Prior to any mitigation, CCHSHMP held a tailgate safety briefing. CCHSHMP applied absorbent pads on top of the residual oil that reached the water. Additionally, CCHSHMP applied soft petroleum-absorbing boom to contain the oil release. CCHSHMP picked up the four (4) 5-gallon buckets adjacent to a CCCPW orange cone. It turned out that the paint appeared to be more like tar. Oily debris in a bag next to the tar was also picked up for disposal. CCHSHMP departed from the scene at 16:00.
