

## **REPORT:**

On May 26, 2017 at 3:14 PM, Contra Costa Health Services Hazardous Materials Programs (CCHS HMP) Incident Response Team received notification from Con Fire that a small aircraft had crashed at the intersection of Marsh Drive and Solano Way in Concord, CA, just outside the Buchanan Airport. Con Fire incident commander reported that approximately 15 gallons of fuel had leaked out of the plane onto the ground and that absorbant had been placed to prevent fuel from entering the storm drain. A slow leak from the wing fuel tank was ongoing.

CCHS HMP Hazardous Materials Specialists M. Duazo, K. Abramians, L. Friedman, and S. Dwight responded in HM1 and HM3, arriving on scene at 3:41 PM. CCHS HMP personnel performed air monitoring in the vicinity of the crash using a PID and 4 gas meter and confirmed that no readings above background were detected in areas where personnel were staged. Response operations could not commence until the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA), in conjunction with the National Transportation Safety Board, evaluated the scene. After clearance from the FAA, two CCHS HMP personnel (L. Friedman and K. Abramians) donned level C respiratory protection and turnouts and removed and containerized the aviation gas from the two wing tanks of the plan. Two CCHS HMP personnel (M. Duazo and S. Dwight) performed additional air monitoring and back up entry roles. Contra Costa County Buchanan Airport personnel manned a hose line as an emergency precaution. CCHS HMP personnel then mitigated the aviation gas on the ground using additional absorbant and containerized the waste. One 30 gallon drum of waste aviation gas, one 5 gallon container of absorbant contaminated with aviation gas, and one 5 gallon container of oily debris were transported to the CCHS HMP hazardous waste storage area for disposal.

HM1 and HM3 departed the scene at 7:12 PM.
