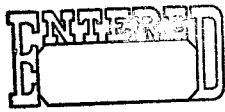

**REPORT:**

On June 13, 2017 at 6:08 PM, Contra Costa Health Services Hazardous Materials Programs (CCHS HMP) Incident Response Team received notification from Con Fire Dispatch that a hazardous condition had occurred at the JC Penney located at 4951 Slatten Ranch Road in Antioch, CA. Approximately 11 JC Penney shoppers reported irritation and respiratory distress inside the store due to an unknown substance, possibly pepper spray. 2 patients were transported to the hospital.

Hazardous Materials Specialists (HMS) C. Tougeron, J. Pham, and D. LeCount responded at 6:48 PM in HM1 and arrived on scene at approximately 7:12 PM. K. Abramians and L. Friedman responded at 7:18 in HM3. S. Dwight responded to scene in a POV. HM3 and Dwight arrived on scene at approximately 7:40 PM.

Con Fire personnel had responded and were treating the victims. The building was ventilated both mechanically and naturally since the arrival of Con Fire personnel.

HMS K. Abramians and C. Tougeron performed entry into JC Penney with air monitoring devices to attempt to recon the areas of concern and eliminate potential toxic gases as threats. CCHS HMP air monitoring equipment cannot directly identify pepper spray. Air monitoring devices included the QRAE (4 gas meter), Ultra RAE PID, chlorine gas badge, Juno, and Halogen detectors. No readings above background were detected throughout the store. No visible discolorations or sources were identified.

A site safety briefing was performed prior to the entry and an ICS form 208 (Site Safety and Control Plan) was prepared. Con Fire BC Atlas served as Incident Commanders during the response. Con Fire personnel served as back up rescue operations during entry and assisted with decontamination.

HM1, HM3, and Dwight departed the scene at 9:28 PM.
