

CCHS Duty Officer (MJH) received telephone call from WCPD Bomb Squad officer Lee Herrington. WCPD is on scene at a law firm that employs a female employee that was suspected of sprinkling white powder at co-workers work stations. Facility set up hidden cameras and caught her doing this morning. She was questioned and would not say what the powder was. Employees were exposed. They were told to stay onsite and wash up. HazMat enroute to ID white powder. MJH and LF had pre-arranged LF would take blue at noon, LF assumes lead position.
