Notice of Proposed Unified Program Fee Changes THIS IS NOT AN INVOICE

Contra Costa Health Hazardous Materials Programs (CCHHMP) has diligently provided education, training, response and inspection services to Contra Costa County businesses and residents for hazardous materials/waste since 1985. To implement the Unified program, which consolidates multiple environmental and emergency management programs, CCHHMP charges annual permit fees to regulated businesses. These fees were last updated in 2012, and there have been significant changes in regulatory requirements and long-term planning for implementing the Unified Program. CCHHMP is conducting a thorough reassessment of the fee structure to ensure it is fair for all regulated facilities. CCHHMP has hired a consultant to assist with developing a new fee structure to ensure sustainable program funding.
