- Comments and suggestions for future community forums include:
 - too noisy, couldn't hear in the small groups, not enough space (10 comments) spread the tables out, have fewer people in a group, eliminate the tables so people could sit closer.
 - do it later in the day so more people will come.
 - provide more time for each discussion item (3 comments).
 - have cards at each table so people could write comments as they are listening to the discussion.
 - invite more agencies as well as individual service providers. (2 comments)
 - have more discussion on children of trauma.
